

HOW TO PLAY "FUNNY SCRIPT"

It's a great game for creative kids or adults and can be entertaining. It is a "paper telephone" variation.

Best for: Group of about 3.

What you need: Each player will need a piece of paper and a pencil or pen to write with.

How to play:

Players sit in a circle, it is better to sit closer to each other, so it is faster to pass the paper. Everyone starts by writing a sentence at the top of his or her paper. It can be something random, true, abstract, from a song lyric, or about someone in the room.

Once everyone has a sentence at the top of the paper, everyone folds the top part of the paper over so it covers the first sentence and passes their paper to the player to their right.

Then again, everyone writes a sentence at the top of his or her paper. Again fold the top part of the paper over and pass the paper to the player to their right. Everyone continues alternately writing sentences, always covering up the latest sentence and passing to the right.

The game lasts at least 5 rounds.

In the last round: After everyone is done writing, players unfold the papers they have. Then you go around as everyone one by one reads a paper out loud. It's always funny to hear how the first sentence turned into the last one.

Variation: The Caller will announce the topics to write about,

for example :

- 1. Write a name
- 2. Write what the person was doing
- 3. Write where he was doing it
- 4. Write why he was doing it
- 5. Write with whom he was doing it
- 6. Write what happened next
